Most Fruit Trees are Diploid Pollinators, Pollination is an important topic when growing fruit trees because many - but certainly not all - varieties require pollination from a compatible donor tree before they can set fruit.

Apple Trees		Tree Characteristics:	Quantity Ordered	Total
Empire EMLA 111 Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 18-22ft.		Jucy white inside, more Sweet than tart, Extra crisp. Great for eating fresh and in salads and for making sauces. Grows upright and vigorous, very consistant crop. Bloom time is mid April, Blooms are pink-white, Fruit ripens early October		
Gayla EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Mild sweet flavor, juicy with crisp yellow flesh, great for eating fresh and in salads. Blooms time May, Bloom color, pink-white. Fruit ripens in September.		
Golden Delicious EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Sweet and mellow, Crisp and Juicy, Good for eating fresh, putting in salads, making pies and sauces and for baking. Bloom time is Mid-April, Bloom color is pink-white. Bears fruit at a young age, Tree has round shape with wide crotch angles. Fruit ripens mid September.		
Honey Crisp EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Very sweet, crisp and juicy, Med size fruit, red with orange and yellow stripes. Hardy and vigorous. Tolerates temperatures down to -40. Bloom time April. Bloom Color pink-white. Fruit ripens early-mid September.		
Ida Red EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Good eating apple, Slightly tart & juicy, all purpose apple for eating, salads, pies, sauces and baked. Keeps Well. Bears heavily, need to be thinned if bigger apples are desired. Bloom Time: Early-Mid May, Bloom color light pink-white. Fruit ripens early October.		
Liberty EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Medium sized apple with yellow colored flesh. Vigorous tree that is disease resistant with a spreading growth habit. Blooms in April. Bloom color is pink-white. Fruit ripens in September.		
Lodi EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Lodi is a pale yellow fruit with a deeper yellow flush. A large apple that is crispy and juicy and has a sweet-tart flavor. Great for sauces. A spreading growth habit, and very vigorous. Resistant to apple scab. Blooms in May. Bloom color pink-white. Fruit ripens in late July.		
Macintosh EMLA 7A, Semi-Dwarf, Mature Height 12-15ft.		Skin is intense red, taste is bold, sweet-sour, and somewhat acidic; texture is soft, with very aromatic flesh. Great for eating fresh and cooks down well for sauces. Tree growth is dense and drooping. Blooms in May. Blooms are white. Fruit ripens in early September		
Northern Spy EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Large yellowish apple with light red striping. Cream colored flesh, juicy, crisp, rich, aromatic flavor. Excellent for eating fresh & cooking. Not good for drying. Trees grow upright with large growth habit. Blooms early-mid May. Bloom color pink-white. Fruit ripens in early October.		
Red Delicious EMLA 7A Semi-Dwarf Mature Height 12-15ft.		Fruit is firm with red skin with darker red streaks, and five "points" on the bottom. Has white flesh that is aromatic and sweet, with a bit of a crunchy texture to it. Keeps very well, and is often used for decoration. Good for eating. Blooms in April. Bloom color is white. Fruit mid-late September.		
Wolfriver EMLA 26 Dwarf Mature Height 10-12ft.		A very large apple with dark red flush. Soft, juicy flesh. Good for baking and drying. Spreading growth habit. Blooms early-mid May. Blooms are pink-white. Fruit ripens mid September		

Cherry Trees

Stella	Large, heart shaped dark red fruit similar to Lamber. Sweet, juicy flesh with rich flavor. First good quality, self fertile sweet cherry, Moderately crack resistant. Vigorous, productive and very hardy tree and bears at a young age. Good pollinizer for other trees. Fruit Early July		
Bing	Standard black sweet cherry. Large fruit dark red to black color. Rich, sweet, firm purplish flesh. Excellent for eating, canning and preserves. Pollinates with following varieties- Sam, Van, Black Tartarian, Ranier, or Stella. Will not pollinate Royal Ann. Fruit June		
Lapins	A large dark cherry very similar to Bing, now becoming the full orchard replacement tree for Bing commercially. Split resistant, self fertile with a firm rich flavor. Lapins resists late frosts and is an exceptionally heavy producer. Fruit Mid July		
Hedelfingen	An old European variety with exceptional firm, large, sweet black fruits of excellent quality for freezing, canning or fresh out of hand eating. Crack resistant. A good hardy pollinator. The tree is winter hardy and bears heavy crops early on in the life of the tree. Use any other sweet cherry		

Danube	Introduced by Michigan State University, Danube is like a cross of pie and sweet cherry. Very large, firm, deep burgundy-red fruits have thick red flesh and red juice with unique sweet flavor and high sugar content that makes them exceptionally delicious for fresh eating, desserts and home wine-making. Ripening early to mid-July, the cherries store well, keeping for days at room temperature. Trees are self-fertile and grow 10 to 15 feet tall		
Jubilem	An early maturing, dark red tart cherry variety for the fresh market. Ripening ten days before Montmorency, this dark fleshed cherry is excellent to start the season and produces large fruit with good keeping qualities.		

Plum Trees

Santa Rosa	Beautiful, large, red fruits with gold flesh. This big producer developed by Luther Burbank bears sweet plums that are delicious when eaten fresh, cooked or canned. The tree is vigorous and easy-to-grow. Originates from Santa Rosa, California in 1906. Heat-tolerant. Clingstone. Ripens in mid-July. Self-pollinating.		
Methley	Medium sized fruit is reddish purple with deep red flesh that is sweet and mild with a distinctive flavor. Vigorous upright tree does well on most soils. Early blooms are bud hardy and is a good pollinator for early varieties. Self-fertile and a heavy bearer. Ripens over a long period, requiring several pickings from mid to late July throughout early August. An excellent choice for northern climates.		
Shiro	Fruit is round, medium to large in size with a yellow color. Flesh is sweet, mild and juicy. Clingstone. Tree is hardy with a spreading habit and is a productive and consistent bearer. Thrives in full sun and well drained soils. Fruit ripens late July/early August.		
Duarte	Large, heart shaped plum with deep red skin and flesh color. Fruit is large and very juicy and sweet when fully ripe. Excellent plum for eating fresh. Ripens mid-August		
Stanley	Medium to large, oval dark blue fruit. Flesh is very sweet, firm and tender with fine grain. Flavor is rich. Freestone. Excellent for canning, preserves, drying or eating out of hand. Bears early, blooms late and is a heavy annual producer. The most popular of all prune plums. Trees are vigorous and self fertile, however, yield increases when cross pollinated. Ripens early September.		

Peach Trees

Elberta	An old favorite large yellow peach with a deep golden yellow skin blushed with red. Skin is fairly tough. The flesh is tender and juicy, with an excellent texture and quality. Excellent for desserts, freezing, canning and jam. Ships well. Trees are hardy, productive and disease resistant. Fruit Ripening Time: Early September		
Glohaven	Large, almost round, uniform peach is mostly red with deep yellow ground color. Flesh is firm and resistant to browning. Excellent quality. Tree is vigorous with moderately hardy buds. Fruit Ripening Time: Early - mid August.		
Redhaven	The standard of all early peaches. The color on this medium sized round peach is red over golden yellow. Flesh is very firm, smooth textured and of good flavor. Highly versatile. Requires heavy thinning. Winter hardy. Fruit Ripening Time: Early August		

Pear Trees

Bartlett	Large, heavy bearing variety with excellent quality. Long considered one of the choicest canning varieties. Bartlett accounts for about 75% of the US and Canadian pear production. Tree is vigorous and very productive. Fruit Ripening Time: Late August		
D'Anjou	A very high quality dessert pear. Skin is light green in color and does not change to yellow upon ripening. A good pollinator for Bartlett. Flesh is very juicy, sweet and rich in flavor. Fine texture. The tree is very hardy, bears early and is quite blight resistant. Stores and ships well. Fruit Ripening Time: Mid September		
Moonglow	A medium sized pear with yellow skin and soft white, sweet, juicy flesh. Combines high quality with resistance to fireblight. Tree is upright, heavily spurred and vigorous - sometimes bearing fruit early on in the life of the tree. Fruit Ripening Time: Early September		
Bosc	A large russet pear with white flesh and an excellent rich, sweet, juicy delicious flavor. Rapidly becoming a major commercial variety. Tree is vigorous, somewhat upright and productive. Requires a pollinator such as Bartlett. One of the best long keeping varieties. Fruit Ripening Time: Late September/early October		
Strawberries Jewel	The picture-perfect strawberry — bright red and glossy. The berries from this compact grower have an excellent flavor and enticing aroma that is great for fresh eating or freezing. They are also firm enough to be inserted into beautiful fruit arrangements. Disease-resistant to leaf spot and scorch. Cold hardy. Ripens in June. Self-pollinating.
